Dear LBC School Community,

As we usher in the snow and winter weather, I would like to take this opportunity to inform you of the many events occurring here during the month of November.

If you cannot make it to the school during the conference times, I encourage you to reach out to your child's classroom teacher and set up an alternate time to meet.

Our term one awards assembly is set to take place at 2:15 PM on November 22nd in the gym. This assembly allows us to celebrate the accomplishments of our students and recognize their efforts and contributions to our school. Please join us if you are able.

On a final note, I would like to address a global issue. We understand that the recent escalating conflict in Israel and Gaza has been widely covered in the news and on social media. Some of the images and videos being shown/shared are violent and graphic. We encourage you to monitor your child's media exposure and be aware of what they are accessing on the internet. It's important to ensure they are exposed to age-appropriate content and to limit exposure if it becomes overwhelming. Please also encourage your child/children to see the human side of these events by discussing the impact on people's lives and the importance of compassion for those affected. We also understand that some of you may be connected to friends and family in this area and encourage you to contact the school if your child needs additional support.

Remember that open and honest communication can help alleviate fears and provide a better understanding of the world's complexities. It's an opportunity to teach your children about empathy, critical thinking, and global issues.

Democracy is Strong at LBC



"I liked that in our election people were awesome to each other. I didn't win, but I learned that politics is a harsh reality. I wish I was premier." Sanan, Gr. 6



Parent Portal Absence Reporting

In the Parent Portal (this does not work in the PowerSchool app only the web portal), a new left navigation icon will appear under the ATTENDANCE HISTORY icon.



Clicking the EXCUSE ABSENCES icon will open up an attendance summary screen

The summary screen has either 1 or 2 buttons, a box showing any outstanding parent portal attendance requests not yet cleared by the school in the Admin Portal, and all historical attendance data, separated by year tabs showing the date, period, course and attendance type is shown.

Attendance Information for Hannah

If the parent portal account is tied to only 1 student at that school, they will only have the single button on the left. If the parent has more than 1 student <u>in the same school</u> tied to their parent portal account, they will see 2 buttons and can excuse all absences for those students with 1 entry by using the button on the right.

Single Student Excuse Absence Entry Screen

Parents enter the date of the absence, if it is more than 1 day then can select that option (will record the start and end dates) and they can either select ALL DAY or enter the time or periods of the absence.

They then select the type of absence and can enter an optional comment.



Multiple Student Excuse Absence Entry Screen

Excuse Absences for Alyssa, Hannah

This option is available if the parent has more than 1 student IN THE SAME SCHOOL tied to their parent portal account. The parent has the same entry options as the single student entry page but note thatwhen using the multi-student option, they will submit the data to a confirmation page first and then save the data on the following screen.

Confirmation page lists the records that will becreated. Parent can either submit the data or cancel.

SAFETY SCOOP

ON BEHALF OF THE SEINE RIVER SCHOOL DIVISION VIOLENCE THREAT AND RISK

Safety within our buildings and school communities is a vital part of the wellbeing of our staff and students in Seine River School Division. SRSD takes threats seriously and utilizes a specific protocol to address any threats that happen within our school buildings. The protocol we follow is called the Violence Threat and Risk Assessment (VTRA) created by Center for Trauma Informed Practices.

The primary purpose of the VTRA process is to assess the risk to others and provide appropriate interventions to reduce that risk. This is an intervention process, both students who have made threats as well as students impacted by the threat are offered ongoing support in order to promote safety and wellbeing within our school community. This process is meant to be helpful not hurtful therefore it is not a disciplinary process and takes in to consideration how this threat maybe impacting both individuals and the system as whole.

To better understand the VTRA process, please read the Fair Notice document below.



STUDENT VIOLENCE THREAT RISK ASSESSMENT FAIR NOTICE

Seine River School Division is committed to creating and maintaining school environments in which students, staff, parents/guardians/caregivers and others feel safe.

Schools cannot ignore any threat of violence.

What is a threat?

- An expression of intent to do harm or act
- out violently against someone or something
 may be verbal, written, drawn, posted on the Internet, or made by the gesture.

Duty to Report

To keep school communities safe and caring, staff, parents/guardians/caregivers, students and community members must report all threat related behaviours to the school principal.

What is the purpose of a Student Violence Threat Risk Assessment?

- to ensure and promote the emotional and physical safety of students, staff, parents, the student making the threat, and others
- to ensure a full understanding of the context of the threat
- to understand the factors and contribute to the threat maker's behaviour
- to be proactive in developing an intervention plan that addresses the emotional and physical safety of the threat maker
- to promote the emotional and physical safety of all

The information in this brochure reflects the thinking and work of J. Kevin Cameron, Director of the Canadian Centre for Threat Assessment and Trauma Response.

What behaviours warrant a Student Violence Threat Risk Assessment to be initiated?

A student Violence Threat Risk Assessment will be initiated for behaviours including, but not limited to:

- serious violence or violence with intent to harm or kill self or others
 - verbal/written threats to harm or kill others (clear, direct, and plausible)
- online threats to harm or kill others
- possession of weapons (including replicas)
 bomb threats (making and/or detonating
- explosive devices)
- fire starting
- sexual intimidation or assault
- gang related intimidation and violence

What Parents and Students Need to Know

- any threat must be reported to the school principal
- investigation may involve the student services counsellor, a member of the divisional clinical team, the police of jurisdiction, or other community agencies
- investigation may involve locker or personal property searches
- interviews will be held with the threat maker and other students or adults who may have information about the threat
- parents of students who are directly involved will be notified
- threatening behaviour may result in disciplinary action
- an intervention plan may be developed for the student making the threat and a support plan developed for any individuals targets by threats


